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Dr. Tsutani received his MD at School of Medicine of Tokyo Medical and Dental University (TMDU, 1979). Besides his training in Western medicine, he received training in Kampo (traditional Japanese) medicine at the Oriental Medicine Research Center of the Kitasato Institute (1979-1981). After completing his PhD in clinical pharmacology (1983), he joined the WHO and served as a first Medical Officer for Traditional Medicine at the Regional Office for the Western Pacific, Manila (1984-1990). He had been a Research Fellow at the Takemi Program in International Health, Harvard School of Public Health (1990-91). After he returned to Japan, he became Associate Professor of Clinical Pharmacology, TMDU. In 2001 he moved to the University of Tokyo (UTokyo) and became Professor of Pharmacoeconomics, then in 2006, Professor of Drug Policy and Management, at Graduate School of Pharmaceutical Sciences. Since April 2015, he has been Professor at Tokyo Ariake University of Medical and Health Sciences, and Visiting Professor of UTokyo. He had been a Ministry of Health and Welfare (MHW) Topic Leader for MedDRA of ICH (1995-1998), Member of CIOMS Working Group for Pharmacogenetics (2002-2005), Member of WHO Expert Advisory Panel for Drug Evaluation (2006-2014), and President of the Japanese Society for History of Pharmacy (2012-2016).
